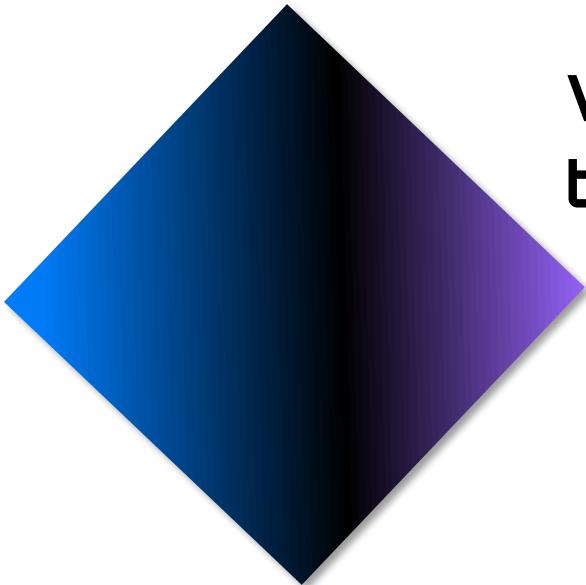
Our 2-day class shows you how to use Excel VBA to build powerful automated engineering and science tools.
